1. Entries: Accepted on a first come, first service basis either online, by mail or drop off. Submit fully completed mail-in entries and required documents with payment (checks made payable to Bar A Ranch) to the Show Secretary, Kelly Stapleton, address 28475 N. 84th Street, Scottsdale, AZ 85266, or through the Fox Village on-line entry portal http://entry.foxvillage.com

Note: Upload required documents to Fox Village <u>prior</u> to completing entry for this show. The FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT and WAIVER AND RELEASE OF LIABILITY WAIVER <u>MUST</u> indicate "DRESSAGE AT BAR" in the blank. These documents must be submitted with your online show entry if you do not want to be charged up to \$30 for an incomplete entry fee. An entry must be completed for each horse/rider combination. Entries must be completed, received and paid for by 11:00pm on the closing date. Entries received after this date and time will be charged a late/post entry fee of \$50.

An entry number will not be issued to you without:

- 1) USEF Entry Agreement with "Dressage at Bar A" listed (form attached to this Prize List)
- 2) <u>USEF Waiver & Release with "Dressage at Bar A" listed</u> (form attached to this Prize List). A **separate** signed form is required for the Rider, Owner, Trainer and Coach.
- 3) Correct USDF and USEF number verification for horse, owner, rider, and trainer;
- 4) Current Safe Sport status; and
- 5) Full payment. Parents or legal guardians must sign a minor's entry.

Entries submitted without fully completed USEF Entry Agreement, USEF Waiver & Release (Rider, Owner, Trainer and Coach, if applicable) and copies of verification of USEF and USDF numbers for Horse, Rider and Owner will be a charge for incomplete entry fee of \$30.00

By signing the entries, riders competing on more than 2 horses, agree that they may have less than 50 minutes between rides on different horses. The signature is agreement in writing per USEF DR126.2.b.5.

Entry confirmation will be e-mailed to the <u>rider</u>. It is the rider's responsibility to verify their e-mail address is correct in Fox Village during the entry process.

Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport Training requirements to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Preventions Policies. More information about these can be found at www.usef.org. No refunds will be given if the rider, owner, trainer or coach cannot provide proof of completion.

Vaccination records must be available for examination per USEF GR844. Competition management may request proof of vaccination or waiver be provided. No refund will be given for any rule violation.

2. Entry Cancellation/Refunds: Entries with written cancellation before the closing date will receive a refund of all fees minus the \$50 office fee. Entries with written cancellation received after closing but before the competition has started will receive a refund of USEF fee and Qualifying fees ONLY. No refunds once the competition has started.

- 3. Post Entries: Will be accepted after the initial closing date if the schedule permits and will be subject to a late fee of \$50.00. Competitors and horses already entered in the show will receive priority.
- 4. Class Change Requests (no change in horse or rider): After the initial closing date will be subject to a fee of \$25.
- 5. **No Refunds or Credits:** In the event a class or classes, or all or part of the competition is cancelled due to severe weather or other emergency conditions, no refunds or credits will be given.
- 6. **Stabling:** Stabling is limited and will be available on a first come, first served basis. Depending on demand Tack Stalls may be available. Stalls are temporary 10 x 10 barn stalls (fully enclosed) with cover and swinging doors. Possible permanent barn stalls with sliding doors in the Main and/or Jr. Barn. Bar A Ranch makes every effort to ensure safe stabling for all horses. We strongly advise that every competitor closely examine each assigned stall for safety issues before putting a horse in the assigned stall. Please immediately communicate any safety concerns to our Competition Management prior to using the stall. Repairs will be made, or an alternative stall will be provided if appropriate. All horses on site overnight must be stabled.
- 7. Stall Fee: Friday-Sunday \$300 (stalls are adequately pre-bedded), we provide a bucket for you to pick your manure into and will dump it for you. Bar A would appreciate you taking your trailer home while the show is going on. Trailer parking space is very limited. If you must leave your trailer on site, please contact Kelly Stapleton at 480-650-9661 to check availability which will be based on paid, completed entries on a first come, first served basis.
- 8. **Day Stall**: \$150 (stalls are adequately pre-bedded) **Overnight stabling will take priority in determining availability of Day Stall.
- 9. **Stallions Stabling:** Prior to entering the show, **please contact Kelly Stapleton at 480-650-9661 to determine if stabling is available to accommodate a stallion.** All stallions must be attended to or stabled at all times.
- 10. **Haul-Ins:**: When not stabling, a haul-in fee of \$60 per day is charged. Haul in on warm up day (Friday) is \$20 and must be pre-arranged with **Kelly Stapleton at 480-650-9661**. **Haul-in trailers must be parked in designated areas. Please contact Kelly Stapleton at 480-650-9661** to advise of your arrival time and size of trailer so we can best accommodate you.

- 12. **Ride Times:** Preliminary ride times and a show schedule will be available on the Fox Village website no later than the Wednesday before the show. It is the responsibility of the rider to inform the Show Secretary of any time conflicts as soon as possible after receiving the schedule.
- 13. **Scratches During Show**: Competitors have the responsibility to inform the Show Secretary in the Show Office of their intent to scratch a ride prior to the scheduled ride time. Scratches will not be accepted at the competition arena or with the Ring Steward. Scratches are not refundable.
- 14. **No Shows**: All "No Shows" that have not contacted the show office will be considered a scratch for the rest of the show, forfeit all their entry fees, and time slots may be filled.
- 15. **Ribbons**: Awarded First through Third Place in all classes Intro Level to Grand Prix. In classes where multiple divisions are ridden together, the ribbons will be pinned by division within the class. Test of Choice (TOC), Introductory and Equitation classes will be pinned by class regardless of division or level ridden within the class. Weekend High Point ribbons are awarded for the divisions of Adult Amateur, Junior/ Young Rider and Open (eligible classes from Training through Fourth Level) and FEI regardless of division (eligible classes PSG through GP). High Point Award Training through Fourth Level, regardless of division, will be awarded and High Point Award PSG through GP, regardless of division will be awarded. You must enter both Saturday and Sunday to be eligible for High Point Ribbons and Awards. Introductory, Equitation and Freestyle tests are not eligible toward High Point.

- 16. Hours: The Show Office (located in the lounge in the Main Barn) will be open Friday from 4:00 pm 6:00 pm, Saturday and Sunday one hour before rides start until rides finish. Bar A Ranch facility will be open to competitors on Friday from 12:00 pm 6:00 pm for stabling set up and schooling in the arenas (set up takes priority and riders will need to ride in the other arena while any set up is being performed.)

 Saturday/Sunday hours are 6:00 am 6:00 pm. During the show, the Competition Arena will be open for hand walking only around the outside of the dressage court up to one half (1/2) hour prior to the start of the first class. Mounted schooling is permitted in the Competition Arena after the last competition ride for that day. All rings and lunging area will close at 6:00pm each night.
- 17. Parking: Cars, trucks and trailers allowed only in designated areas.
- 18. **Dogs:** No dogs will be permitted on the grounds. By signing the entry form, you agree to these terms and will advise friends and family that come to watch you of the same.
- 19. **Sharps Container:** Use Sharps container provided in the Main Barn Vet Lab. Competition Management may fine any individual, including trainers, owners, exhibitors, or their agents, up to \$100 for improper disposal of needles or other sharp disposable instruments.
- 20. **Bridle Numbers:** All competitors must complete check-in at the show office and receive a show number, before schooling or riding on the show grounds. Failure to check in at the show office prior to schooling will result in the issuance of a Warning Card. Competition-assigned numbers, or the same number in a personal numbering format, must be worn and visible at all times when a horse is being hand-walked, exercised or ridden, under penalty of elimination.
- 21. **Arenas:** The Competition Arena is 20m X 60m with TruTex Footing and sand mixture, and fully covered. The Warmup arena is outside and a sand/dirt footing mixture, with a separate lunging area. Lunging is allowed only in the designated lunging area and not in the warm-up arena.

In the unlikely event the show officials, show management and facility managers feel the footing is unsafe for horses and riders to compete due to weather or other acts of nature no refunds will be given. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to contact the Show Manager to determine whether the show is canceled.

- 22. **Note to Competitors:** Show management reserves the right to make changes including, but not limited to, cancel, split or combine classes, limit class size, change arenas, limit the number of rides and number of horses per rider and cancel, add or change judges. The show committee reserves the right to refuse any entry for cause. Show management reserves the right to deny entry to any competitor if the competitor or owner has outstanding debt to Bar A Ranch.
- 23. **Headgear Rule**: From the time horses are officially admitted to the competition grounds by competition management, anyone mounted on a horse at any time on the competition grounds, including non-competing riders, riders on non-competing horses, mounted participants in exhibition classes and those competing in all classes and tests, including Para-Equestrian tests, must wear protective headgear as defined by this rule and otherwise in compliance with GR801. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. Protective headgear is defined as a riding helmet which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society

for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. The harness must be secured and properly fitted. Unless jackets are waived, while in the competition ring, exhibitors wearing protective headgear must wear a short, dark jacket, dark tailcoat (only permitted for tests above Fourth Level), or Armed Services or police uniform (if eligible), dark hat covers (where applicable) and must otherwise conform to DR120 (see GR801). 7.33.

- 24. **Disease Outbreak Rule:** In the face of a disease outbreak, the show committee reserves the right to follow the AVMA (American Veterinary Medicine Association) and/or the AAEP (American Association of Equine Practitioners) recommendations as to what testing would be necessary to consider a horse free from the disease in question. They also reserve the right to require written proof that said testing has been performed within the recommended period of time. If the competitor does not adhere to the requirements, the show committee can refuse entrance to the show. Some diseases are "Reportable Diseases", meaning they must be reported to the State of Arizona Department of Agriculture. These diseases are subject to quarantine rules of the state. An example of one such disease is Vesicular Stomatitis. In the case of reportable diseases, a health certificate is required from an accredited veterinarian with proper statement regarding said disease to accompany the horse. Since this rule could apply to any number of diseases, and it would be impossible to list them all here, the show committee will post the testing/health certificate requirements on the sponsor web page if there is a current disease outbreak in the area.
- 25. USEF Membership Statement: Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions at the Modified Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A non-member may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, or agent at Regular Competitions, Eventing Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a Show Pass fee.

 Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes
- 26. Operation of Motorized Vehicles: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above-described motorized vehicles if they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/ legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule. The unsafe use of personal

electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds. Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties.

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF OR FEI RULES AND WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE

THEREWITH. It is the responsibility of the competitor to be familiar with these rules. All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final. Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise. The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges. Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste. No person will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the exhibitor and those having official or requested duties to perform. It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in questions, that attendants be neatly dressed, and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretions bar any person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

USDF Statement on Animal Welfare

The United States Dressage Federation, Inc. (USDF), a federation of over 100 independent organizations throughout the United States with a member-ship of nearly 30,000 members, supports the concept of ethical treatment of animals.

Dressage is a classical method of training horses, based upon the horse's natural responses, as carried out in a gradual, planned program during which the horse's athletic abilities are improved in a systematic manner. As a result, the horse becomes capable, comfortable, and responsive in partnership with the rider without the use of force. Dressage competition at various levels of achievement is the ultimate test of the training program to determine whether the desired harmony between horse and rider has been achieved.

The rules pertaining to dressage competition prohibit the use of artificial appliances, training aids, and drugs, which would force the horse to submit. Instead, the emphasis is upon training and a cooperative partnership with the rider. Major competitions are carefully monitored to assure that there is no unnecessary force or harshness displayed.

Unlike other horse sports in which horses enter training at a relatively immature state, dressage training is usually not seriously begun until the horse is three or four. The top levels of achievement require five or more years of progressive training and it is not unusual to see horses in international competition in their late teens. This, in itself, places a premium on good care and soundness throughout the horse's life.

While supporting the concept of animal welfare in its broadest form, the United States Dressage Federation, Inc., also recognizes that it is unrealistic to ascribe human emotions and responses to the horse which in its wild state is a creature of flight, living a hard and precarious existence. Under domestication, the horse is assured of ample food, water, and shelter, as well as protection against infectious diseases and damaging parasites, thus leading a longer and healthier life with a high rate of survival.

As an educational organization, USDF has numerous programs, which teach people how to pursue the accepted, humane training methods. A program of certifying instructors also emphasizes protecting the horse's welfare in pursuit of dressage training.

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of Dressage at Bar A (Competition). I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. 2025 Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships

A single Regional Dressage Championship program organized by the United States Dressage Federation (USDF), and recognized by the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (USEF), will be held in each of the nine USDF regions. In addition, Alaska and Hawaii may each hold state championships if an official request from a Group Member Organization (GMO) is received by April 1 of the prior year. The Regional Championship Program Rules can be found on the USDF website at . Please refer to the 2025 USDF Member Guide for the comprehensive list of rules and requirements for this program.

Membership/Registration Requirements for Qualifying and Championships

All memberships and registrations/recordings must be correct and current at the time qualifying scores are earned and at the time of the championships.

Rider:

- Must have a USDF Participating* Membership (PM).
- Must have a USEF membership (Active or Life).

Horse:

- Must have a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR).
- Must have a USEF (Annual or Lifetime) Horse Recording.
- USDF horse registration and USEF horse recording must be in the name(s) of the current owner(s) or lessee(s).
 A horse is not required to have breed registry papers.
- Horses must be entered in qualifying and championship classes under their official recorded names and ownership as specified in USEF GR1102.3, and transfers of ownership or lease registrations must be completed in compliance with USEF rules GR1105 and GR1108 prior to the competition in order for the horse to compete under the name of the new owner or lessee. (USEF DR127.2)

Owner:

- Must have a USDF Participating or Business Membership and a USEF membership (Active or Life Membership or Annual or
 Life Recorded Farm/Business). If the horse has more than one owner, at least one owner must have both active USEF
 membership and active USDF Participating or Business Membership and must be the owner of record with USEF and USDF.
 For a business or farm to be the valid owner under this requirement, it must be listed as an owner of the horse with both
 USEF and USDF.
- PMs are USDF members who join USDF directly. USDF Group Members (GM) are ineligible.

Minimum Qualifying Scores: One set of nationally-standardized qualifying scores has been established for all USEF/USDF Regional Championships, for Training Level through Grand Prix, in three divisions: open, adult amateur and junior/young rider. The minimum percentages are as follows:

<u>USDF Membership Benefits:</u> USDF is dedicated to education, the recognition of achievement, and promotion of dressage. For details on member benefits, including educational programs, awards, and other opportunities, refer to the *USDF Member Guide* or the USDF website at www.usdf.org.

This competition is recognized by USDF for 2025

Membership Requirements for USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized Competitions: Owners and riders, including foreign riders and owners who are not residents of the US, wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition as a rider or owner/lessee, must have either a USDF Group Membership (GM), Participating Membership (PM), or have a USDF Non-Member (NM) identification number and pay the USDF Non-Member (NM) fee. (Note: USDF Business Members can own horses but cannot compete as riders with their USDF Business Membership.)

Horses competing at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions must have either a USDF Horse Identification (HID) number or a USDF Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR). Proper credentials or verification certificates must be presented to the competition secretary.

Riders and owners wishing to participate in a USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competition, and not able to present the competition secretary with verification of a USDF membership or NM identification, and USDF LHR or USDF HID, must complete a USDF Competition Affidavit Form and pay the \$5 affidavit filing fee. A copy of a completed affidavit form from another competition may also be used for verification purposes for up to 60 days. (Exception: Affidavits cannot be used at Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championships.)

Exceptions:

- Horses competing only in Individual Breed Classes (IBCs) at DSHB competitions, sires and dams of horses in DSHB group classes, where those
 sires or dams are not actually competing in the same competition, horses competing only in breed restricted dressage or DSHB classes at
 Regular Competitions (e.g. all Arabian, all Friesian, or all Morgan classes), or in USDF Introductory Level tests, pas de deux or quadrille, are
 exempt from this requirement. Also exempt are horses ridden in leadline, exhibitions, games and races, classes for 4-H members, walk-trot,
 academy, and opportunity classes.
- Riders and owners/lessees competing only in classes which are exempt from the USDF HID requirements are also exempt from the USDF NM
 identification number and NM fee requirements. Also exempt are handlers of horses competing in DSHB In-Hand or Group classes.

Memberships Defined

Participating Membership (PM): A membership issued to an individual directly by USDF. The membership year is December 1 through November 30. PMs are available for 1-year (\$100), 5-years (\$400), or life (\$2,000). A USDF Youth Participating Membership (YPM) is available for individuals who have not reached their 21st birthday by December 1 of the current membership year (\$80). A PM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and to participate as a rider and/or owner/lessee for all Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards and the Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional Dressage Championship program.

Group Membership (GM): A membership issued to an individual by USDF when the member name and dues are submitted to USDF through an affiliate Group Member Organization (GMO). The GM year begins December 1 and ends November 30. A GM allows the member to compete at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions and participate in the USDF Rider Awards Program.

Business Membership (BM): A membership that runs December 1 through November 30 and is issued to a business or organization directly by USDF. The USDF BM (\$280) offers a wider variety of advertising benefits. BMs satisfy requirements of horse ownership only.

Non-Member (NM) Identification Number: For each USDF NM owner/lessee and USDF NM rider there will be a USDF NM fee of \$55 per competition that must be collected by the show secretary and submitted to USDF, along with the USDF Report of Fees document and the \$5 affidavit fee and Competition Affidavit Form if the person cannot provide a copy of their USDF NM card. Owners/lessees or riders exempt from the NM number requirements are also exempt from paying the USDF NM fee. If there are multiple owners of a horse and all are NMs, only one of the owners must pay the NM fee. If the horse has at least one owner who is a current USDF PM, GM, or BM there is no NM fee assessed. Competition management will be invoiced for all applicable USDF NM fees not received with the USDF post-competition paperwork, along with a report listing all USDF NMs. Competition management is then required to submit the NM fees within 30 days to the USDF. An individual with a USDF NM identification number is not eligible for any USDF membership benefits. Once a USDF NM number has been assigned, a USDF NM card can be obtained from the USDF website.

Horse Identification (HID) Number: A one-time tracking number for horses (\$45). Scores earned by a horse with an HID number will be recorded but will NOT be counted towards Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards. A horse with an HID number is not eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying or championship classes. An HID number can be upgraded to a Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) for a fee of \$95. If a horse has a USDF LHR it does not need an HID number. An HID number is a one-time fee that does not need to be renewed.

Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR): A horse with an LHR (\$140) is eligible for Adequan®/USDF Year-End Awards, and eligible to compete in Great American Insurance Group/USDF Regional qualifying and championship classes, assuming requirements for the owner and rider are met. If a horse has an LHR it does not need an HID number. An LHR does not need to be renewed.

How to Join USDF

Applications for USDF Participating Membership (PM), Business Membership (BM), Horse Identification (HID) number, and Lifetime Horse Registration (LHR) may be found in the following locations:

- On the USDF website: www.usdf.org. You can submit the application online or download the form.
- In the show office at USEF-licensed/USDF-recognized competitions classified by USEF as Dressage Competitions, and Regular Competitions which are open to all breeds.

The effective date of membership is the date the form and correct fees are received in the USDF office or, if applying at a competition, the date accepted by the competition secretary, provided the application is signed and dated by the competition secretary, member, and/or horse owner on that same day.
